BROAD OUTREACH AND INITIATIVES

KGNU has an internship program designed to equip members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment. - Established **training** programs designed to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for higher level positions.

KGNU has a radio training program for community volunteers, so that they can learn the skills needed for broadcast in news, public affairs and music. KGNU offers scholarships to those who need financial assistance. At least two training sessions are held each month; attendance at a KGNU orientation session is required before applicants are eligible. KGNU charges \$50 for regular radio training classes and use of studios by students; scholarships are to cover the cost of the training.
